

These children also enjoyed playing in the park in 1902. What kind of games do you think they played?






What do you do with the money you earn?

In 1917, Children were encouraged to use their money to buy stamps that helped support World War I efforts. What do you spend your money on today?







Did you know that children in the 1920's also played on the playground during recess?


They may not have had all the fun things that you have today but I bet they played games like "Hopscotch" or "Tag". Have you played those games?

This is a photo of children enjoying the water and warm weather in Murfreesboro, TN.






