

Sgt. George Jordan

The Only Veteran from Williamson County to receive the Congressional Medal of Honor

- Born into slavery in Williamson County, Tennessee
- Joined the Buffalo Soldiers in the 9th Calvary
- Sent to the West to protect new settlers and keep the peace with the Native Americans during the Apache War
- Saved the lives of the American settlers at Fort Tularosa and was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor
- After a 30-year military career, Sgt. Jordan became sick, but was denied entry into a military hospital because he was Black. Jordan died from the illness in 1904.

George Jordan is born into slavery in Williamson County

Break out into three groups based upon your assigned point of view. After time to discuss, come together as a whole group.


POV Group One: Buffalo Soldiers who are comprised of newly free African American men who are helping to rebuild their country post- Civil War


